1. To the Chief Musician, [a Psalm] of David. The degenerate said in his heart, "There is no God." They have acted corruptly and abominably, there is no doer of good.

4. Do they not know, all the workers of iniquity, who would devour My people as they devour bread, [and] unto Adoniye they call not?

5. There they were in great fear, for God is with the righteous generation.

ו עֲצַת-עֲנִי תְּבִישׁוּ כִּי י' ד' מַחֲסֵהוּ:

6. The counsel of the poor you would put to shame, that Adoniye is his refuge.

7. Oh that out of Zion would come Israel's deliverance! When Adoniye returns the captivity of His people, Jacob will exult, Israel will rejoice.
